- Winners of the award will be announced prior to the West Virginia Sheep and Goat Sale on Saturday, June 4th, 2016.
- Attach one letter of recommendation from 4-H or FFA leader testifying to your level of production, management skills and abilities in building a sheep flock or goat herd.
